An hour of silence to honor and remember the victims of nuclear weapons.

Speakers, music, art, and discussion to create a world without nuclear weapons.

7:00pm-8:30pm | Film screening: *The Beginning of the End of Nuclear Weapons* | Gold Town Nickelodeon Theater

A new 59-minute documentary about the Treaty on the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons.

On July 7th, 2017, 122 countries at the United Nations voted to support a treaty banning nuclear weapons. To date, 23 countries have ratified the treaty. Since 2016, nuclear weapons policy has fallen into crisis, but the TPNW offers hope for a world without nuclear weapons.
